Permitting

- Planning permit 20060221-3 has been extended to 31 December 2024
- All plans and permits are now ready for the operation of the wind farm

Activities On Site

- 23 turbines are fully erected
- Commissioning has commenced and the final hold point is completed
- Brolga surveys have commenced and will continue fortnightly until December
- Post construction noise monitoring has commenced in line with Permit and EPA conditions

Transmission Line & Tarrone Terminal Station

- Monthly meetings with Moyne Shire around project works and community impacts
- All works completed at Hawkesdale Collector Substation
- Minor rehabilitation works to be completed

Do you know about?

Why are the turbines not spinning?

When the wind farm has completed the commissioning and testing phase, there will be times when you drive past the wind farm that some, or all, of the turbines will not be spinning. This can be for a number of reasons:

Weather conditions: The wind turbine generators (WTG) will start to spin when the wind speed reaches 3 meters/second or 10.8 km/hour and stop at 27meters/second or 97.2 km/hour.

Servicing: A WTG is an intricate construction that relies on advanced communications and technology to operate a mechanical contraption. As it is basically mechanical there are a lot of parts that need regular servicing. The WTG is shut down for 3 monthly and annual servicing.

Breakdown: The WTG is a piece of machinery and occasionally, despite a comprehensive maintenance schedule, may breakdown. The regular maintenance minimises the breakdown occurrences but does not always eliminate them.

Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO): AEMO can also stop and start the turbines remotely in response to the market demands. This ensures a steady and reliable supply of electricity to consumers.
